Mountain Lakes District Water Committee Meeting of 11/3/16

Meeting was held from 8:07 AM to 9:04 AM. Attendees: Bob Long, Don Drew, Ken King

Water Status:

The leak on Swiftwater Circle has still not been located. A new valve was installed.

Don had borrowed some equipment to help locate leaks. Don was unable to load the software on his office computer because it was too new and this is old software. Ken tried to set it up on an older laptop system. The software did load but we were not able to get the serial line it uses for communications to work properly. Don will set a time for the person that owns the system to work with us.

Don and Ken met with Scott Clang. We decided that we need a different version of the software. Scott has it and will send us the CD.

There were two incident reports. One was a low level control problem. The second was the Notice of Violation from the state on the late filing of a report. Both issues were resolved.

Master Plan Update:

We will be working with Mark Johanson, a new member of the Planning Board on this effort. Don and Ken met with him on November 11th and gave him an overview of the water system and the issues we want to identify as part of the Master Plan.

Conolle property/spillway:

The latest chart showing the spillway location was filed with the town. A letter was sent from our attorney informing Mr. Conolle of the work to be done to meet the state requirements. There is a renewed effort to agree upon a reasonable price for us to buy that lot.

Lower Dam Project:

Bob got all of the details on the Dubois & King billing. The state has approved the project. They do want another 12 months of monitoring which can be done by Don. We are currently trying to settle with Dubois and King and CCS on who pays for the monitoring effort to date.

Nobis Engineering – Water Sourcing

Nobis had problems with the three new monitoring wells and issues with pumping out the primary well. The MtBE level did drop while the well was being pumped but not to zero.

Other Issues

Don is getting information on the cost of leasing a new District truck.
