

## Mountain Lakes District Water Committee Meeting of 6/7/12

Status: Draft as of 6/14/12 - Reviewed as of 6/16/12 - Approved as of 7/5/12

Purpose of Meeting: This was the June 2012 Water Committee Meeting. The meeting was held at the District Office from 7:33 AM to 8:35 AM on June 7, 2012.

Attendees: Don Drew-Water Department, Peter Olander, Joe McQueeney, Ken King

The minutes of the May 11<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved.

The water usage is back to normal, about 20,000 gallons per day. We will watch the daily usage during the summer and use email alerts on high water usage.

Dry Hydrants - The Water Committee is recommending to the Commissioners that we proceed with the dry hydrant by the mailboxes. The cost is about \$2800. We will add the funding for the other two units to next year's budget. A suggestion was made that we notify the local fire departments when the installation is complete and get them to schedule a training session.

Woodsville Water & Light – We are still waiting on their proposal. Bob is drafting a letter on the financial considerations of any acceptable proposal. We continue to look at other water sources. Scott Clang (Granite State Rural Water Association) has agreed to do a camera inspection of our infiltration well. It will give us a better idea of the possibility of expanding that source.

Tree trimming on lower spillway – Don is waiting for Dennis Connole to return for the summer.

Playground – Don continues to work on the Snack Bar location for the playground. Don discovered a 4” water main in that area and also checked with DigSafe. Don needs to do more testing to determine if that line is still in use.

The Water Committee wanted to clarify some issues relating to the playground. The move of the playground was part of the causeway spillway restoration project. It was included in the plans submitted to the state. No additional approval would have been required for the location by the volleyball net. Several large rocks were moved around that area to provide protection from cars. The area by the Snack Bar has no such protection. Cars drive too fast on “Killer Hill” and on the causeway. The district should install speed bumps in both locations.
