## PLANNING BOARD FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Please note: These FAQS reflect often-heard questions about the Mountain Lakes District <u>ZONING</u> permit application process. Mountain Lakes is a village district of the Town of Haverhill and the Town will require a separate <u>BUILDING</u> permit for most projects within the District. For more information on Haverhill building permits, please contact the Town offices or go to the Haverhill town website: www.haverhill-nh.com.

Before starting the MLD zoning permit process, you need to apply for a Haverhill BUILDING permit as the Haverhill permit application will be a required part of your MLD application packet.

Why do I need a zoning permit? Mountain Lakes was originally a subdivision developed by Town & Country Homes. T & C created restrictions on the use of the subdivision lots called Property Covenants to help ensure the natural beauty and residential community appeal of the District. Now that MLD is a municipality, the MLD zoning ordinance restricts land use in accord with the Covenants and was put into place to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of all the residents of the District.

**What projects require a zoning permit?** Written application for a Zoning Permit must be filed with Mountain Lakes District for any of the following:

- The erection or use of any new building, exterior sign, or other structure.
- The alteration, restoration, moving or demolition of any building, or part thereof.

What do I need for the zoning application package? Here's a chart showing what information is needed for most applications:

When do I need to submit my permit application package? The Planning Board normally meets on the third Thursday of each month (check our website calendar for exact meeting dates). It is important to remember that your permit application must be turned in by 14 days prior to the Planning Board meeting at which you wish it to be considered. The 14-day time frame gives the staff and Board members the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the project before the meeting (and it's also required by state law).

**Do I need to do anything special if I have a lakefront lot?** If you have a lakefront lot, contact the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services for their regulations and requirements. You should definitely check out the sections of the Mountain Lakes District zoning ordinance concerning our Shoreland Protection Overlay and Wetlands Conservation Overlay for more information and also check with the Town of Haverhill to get a copy of their Wetlands Ordinance.

**Do I need to do anything special if my lot contains wetlands?** If you think your lot may contain wetlands, contact the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services for their regulations and requirements. You should definitely check out the sections of the Mountain Lakes District zoning ordinance concerning our Shoreland Protection Overlay and Wetlands Conservation Overlay for more information and also check with the Town of Haverhill to get a copy of their Wetlands Ordinance.

I'm not ready to build just yet, but I want to cut a few trees – do I need a MLD zoning permit? No, but you need to check with the Town of Haverhill to see if you need a permit with them. Also, please note if you clear trees for the purpose of building, you must have an approved MLD zoning permit AND construction must begin within six months of tree clearing. Please contact the District Office for more information.

**Do I need to attend the Planning Board meeting when my application is presented?** The Board strongly encourages that you and/or your contractor be present at the meeting where your application is considered.

What happens after the Board considers my application? The Board can respond to your application in four basic ways:

- Approval: The Board chair will sign the permit application; the original is kept in the District office
  and a copy is sent to Haverhill for their records so you can complete the Haverhill building permit
  process.
- *Tabled:* The Board tables your application because they need more information. It would then be up to you and your contractor to provide the missing information.
- Denied: The Board will explain their decision and give you options should you choose to modify your project.

**Does the District issue an occupancy certificate when my home is completed?** Mountain Lakes uses a Zoning Compliance Checklist (ZCC). Our zoning officer will review your file and do a final inspection to make sure all requirements are met before approving the ZCC. Once the ZCC is signed and you have your copy, you can move into your new home.

What if I want to make changes while my project is in process? Your approved zoning permit covers the "as built" plans provided with your original application. If you make changes to the approved plans, you need to submit a new zoning permit application and documentation showing the desired changes. The new

application will follow the same process as the original and fees will depend on the extent and type of changes you make to your project.

I'm doing interior remodeling – do I need a zoning permit? Interior changes don't require a zoning permit from Mountain Lakes, but they may require a <u>building permit</u> from the Town of Haverhill. On all projects within Mountain Lakes, your first step is to a apply for a building permit from the Town of Haverhill.

I'm not ready to build, but I'm thinking about putting in a driveway – do I need a zoning permit? Driveway permits are issued through the Town of Haverhill if your driveway will intersect a town-maintained road. If your driveway will intersect a private road, you need to apply for a special use permit from the Mountain Lakes Planning Board.

**Is my lot buildable?** There are many things to consider when determining if your intended project will work on your lot, including state septic requirements and NH DES wetlands protection regulations. You need a reputable contractor to help you determine if your lot is buildable according to state, Town and District requirements.

**Can I put a mobile home on my lot?** The original Covenants and Easements specifically prohibit mobile homes. However, manufactured or modular homes are allowed if they are built or assembled on site AND have a full foundation with continuous footing below the frost line. Contact the District Office for more information.

Can I camp or build a tiny home on my lot? MLD is a residential development, not a campground. In keeping with that, the zoning ordinance prohibits inhabiting a camper or RV on our lots, and requires that stored campers be kept on a lot with a primary residence and screened from the road. The zoning ordinance also has a minimum square footage requirement and a full foundation requirement for homes built in MLD. Sorry, but that means no campers, RVs, tents, seasonal structures, mobile homes or tiny homes are allowed to be built or placed in the District.
